DIRECTOR'S NOTES

When I first contemplated proposing My Fair Lady, I'll be honest, it wasn't my top choice. Don't get me wrong, it was high on the list, but there were "bigger and better" shows, newer and hotter shows, etc. on my bucket list. When I sat down to write out my proposals though, that all changed. I got to My Fair Lady, and started thinking what do the Wickeds and Spider-Mans have that the classic don't?



What's changed that makes them more "relevant"? While it's true that the subject matter isn't necessarily as edgy or challenging, it ultimately boils down to "production value". Today's hits have largely built a name for themselves out of larger than life sets and costumes, unexpected music, and choreography that makes a Fosse show look like a year-end recital for a toddlers' ballet class. So why not do that with a classic?

Steampunk is something that has sparked my fancy for a long time now. While I don't consider myself to be steampunk (see the handy intro to steampunk elsewhere in this program), I repeatedly find myself drawn to shows, art, movies, and fashion that have been heavily influenced by a steampunk aesthetic. To walk away from what every previous production has done with this show for the last sixty years was anachronistic enough that I found applying a steampunk influence to be a natural next step! It also gave us the opportunity to re-explore some of the relationships that we've come to take for granted over the years... How do Higgins and Mrs. Pearce interact beyond the basic upstairs/downstairs? What's Colonel Pickering's history? Why does Mrs. Higgins take so strongly to Eliza? And of course, why exactly DOES Eliza allow Henry to treat her the way he does? These are just a few of the themes we tried to delve a little deeper into, and I'm not going to tell you what our answers were, but my challenge for you this evening is to take a step back from Hepburn and Harrison and view these characters with a fresh eye.

What grew from there is what you see in front of you tonight. I am still overwhelmed by the immense amount of research, thought, and work that has gone in to every flower and rivet, every vest and fascinator, every step and every note. Between cast and crew and random helpers, over 70 people have to come together to make this happen, and I can't even begin to thank them enough. They'd have to give me an entire program to myself if I thanked everyone individually so the following will have to suffice: Cast and crew of *My Fair Lady*, you amaze me every day, your talent and passion for what you do is awe inspiring, and I'm so proud of each and every one of you. Production team, all I have to say is: BEST. TEAM. EVER.

WEAR IS STEARFURE

Steampunk simply embodies a time and a place. The time... the late 19th century, the place... a steam powered world, where air travel by fantastical airships and submarines is as common as traveling by car, train, or boat. It's a place where national boundaries and interests are vastly different than our own version of history, where the elegant and refined are as likely to get pulled into a grand adventure as the workers, ruffians, and lower classes. The idea of space travel is not so far-fetched; lost civilizations are found and lost again. Anything is possible, and science can be twisted to meet one's own ends. Visually speaking, there are many references to use for the creation of a Steampunk costume and character. The following are a small sample of classic movies that have inspired Steampunk: Sherlock Holmes, 20,000 Leagues under the Sea, Around the World in 80 Days, the League of Extraordinary Gentlemen, Steamboy, Van Helsing, Wild Wild West, and the Golden Compass... You get the picture. Remember you can come as Doyle's Steampunk version of Professor Moriarty or "Lost Worlds" Edward Challenger or as someone from the pages of history or literature. The sky's the limit. Use your imagination and have fun.



ALAN JAY LERNER (BOOK AND LYRICS)

Alan Jay Lerner was a Broadway lyricist and librettist. The son of a wealthy dress chain store owner (the Lerner Shops), he was educated at Choate Rosemary Hall and Harvard; one of his school chums was John F. Kennedy. Lerner wrote for the Harvard annual musicals, and produced radio scripts after college. In 1942 he was introduced to Frederick Loewe, a partnership which produced such well BIO EXTRACTED FROM MTISHOWS.COM; known shows such as My Fair Lady, Brigadoon, and Camelot.



FREDERICK LOEWE (COMPOSER)

Frederick Loewe (or Fritz) grew up in Berlin with Viennese parents. He learned to play piano by ear before he was seven and would help his father rehearse for the musicals he was working on. Fritz's first collaboration with Alan Jay Lerner was a 1942 musical adaptation of the farce *The Patsy*, called *The Life of the Party*. Their first hit was *Brigadoon*. Fritz won three Tony Awards, all in collaboration with Alan Jay Lerner.
