

Doo-Wop musical (that sparked their career trajectory and made them Disney royalty) is beyond me. But then again, I wonder how many people have similarly questioned what made me take this 'classic' piece of Musical Theatre and thrust it into a Comic Book designed world. Well, let's look at the facts: the musical is about a singing, man-eating plant from outer space who makes a Faustian pact with his keeper, its origin story is a campy sci-fi 'B' movie, and its writers went on to create some of the most famous animated movies of all time. So I ask, how does this show NOT scream comic book!? Pulling off a comic book concept may seem simple, just a few hash marks and scribbles, and black outline everything, right? Wrong. It means looking at every single stage element twice over, not simply building a prop or costume, it's building them and then cartooning them. It's about unifying an integrated art style (Warhol pop art, non Lichtenstein!) throughout the set, the lights, the makeup, etc.. and then once it all comes together, balancing the question "How much is too much?". The concept's inherent challenges were graciously overcome by my incredible team; they took on this two-fold effort and ran with it, they saw any creative roadblock as opportunities to push their limits, tap into what was living in my crazy mind, and take a decade long dream of mine and make it come true. I cannot thank this sterling team enough; every single one of them went above and beyond and mastered their craft to make this show possible. The hundreds of hours that each cast, crew, and team member have put into this show have paid off incredibly, and while Ashman & Menken may have not have ever thought of Skid Row in a comic book world, I think this quirky yet honest story has still been told as intended, perhaps just with a brighter coat of paint over top. Enjoy.


ANNA TONEGUZZI (SCENIC ASSISTANT)
